AM I BECOME YOUR ENEMY BECAUSE I TELL YOU THE TRUTH?

G alatians 4:1 -1 6

A careful study of Paul's epistle to the churches in G alatia is certainly a profitable study for all individuals, even in our modern day society. Paul's inspired message to the G alatians is eternal. All of accountable humanity still need to be instructed about justification from sin. Such occurs by means of the precious blood of C hrist rather than through the M osaic law.

W hile certainly the law of M oses was a very valuable asset to G od's scheme of R edemption, the design of such was to educate humanity dealing with horribleness and terribleness of sin (G alatians 3:13-25). The O ld law was thus temporary until the N ew T estament of C hrist became operative. S ince the N ew covenant was activated on the day of Pentecost in A cts chapter two, accountable individuals are justified by the blood of C hrist by faith in C hrist and obedience to the gospel. Individuals still need to understand the implications of reverting to the M osaic law for authority in religious matters, whether that item be circumcision, the observance of religious holy days, the usage of mechanical instruments of music in worship, a separate priesthood, or whatever. T herefore, the impact of this inspired written work of Paul

continues to the present. Paul's epistle to the G alatians is just as pertinent to the twenty-first century as it is to the first.

In G alatians chapter four Paul argues an inspired case affirming that of justification by the gospel of C hrist. T his chapter is divided into four sub-divisions: (1) A n heir of G od receives justification through C hrist (4:1-7). (2) Paul exhorts individuals to abide in the doctrine of justification by T H E faith (4:8-20). S ection two is sub-divided as follows: (1) A fear that the G alatians will return to a state of bondage (4:8-11); (2) Past relationships used as a basis to appeal to the G alatian brethren to remain faithful; and (3) A n appeal to continue to accept N ew T estament justification based upon an allegory from the O ld T estament.

A s we note our text we observe that those in G alatia had loved Paul to the point where they would have plucked out their eyes and given them to him to assist him in his work in the gospel.

In spite of their former love for him, these brethren had become entangled with false teachers. We as Paul now their enemy because he loved them enough to tell them the truth? Me ay we all remember that true love is not based upon individuals telling us what we want to hear, but rather telling us what we need to know. Me ay we develop a love for truth that will bring a genuine appreciation to all who have enough concern for our souls to give us the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth.

<u>Requirements for telling the truth</u>. As tellers of G od's eternal truth, we must develop a realization that certain contingencies must be met in order that we may effectively present G od's truth.

The presentation of the truth of G od is not something that one engages within just simply to beat another individual over the head. Paul had to confront brethren because of their compromise with the false brethren who came in privily to spy out their liberties. A great deal of turmoil was created within the churches in G alatia over this heresy. Paul, out of a deep and genuine concern for all involved, acted in a controversial manner in opposing that which was sinful. H is action even included rebuking Peter, a fellow C hristian, preacher, and also an apostle of C hrist (G alatians 2:1-14).

T elling the truth seeks the true welfare of others (1 S amuel 18:1-5). T elling the truth recognizes that true liberty comes from such knowledge (J ohn 8:32;15:1-4). T he character of a true friend is demonstrated (M atthew 7:1-5; L uke 22:31-32; J ohn 21:15-18, E phesians 4:15).

Why do we regard friends as enemies because of truth? There are two basic reasons why such is the case: (1) Because of the controversial nature of truth. Because truth is controversial it is not popular and often unpleasant. Note the following passages of scripture: John 8:44; Romans 2:8-11; Hebrews 4:12 (2) Because of our long-established practices and customs many find truth to be very unpopular (Romans 3:10-11; 1 Timothy 3:6; 6:3-4; John 4:6.

<u>How reproof should be administered</u>. In making proper correction one must use proper knowledge (2 Timothy 2:15), proper authority (John 8:26), proper time (E cclesiastes 3:1; Proverbs 6:20), and in the proper manner (E phesians 4:15).

<u>How reproof should be received.</u> When one is scripturally corrected one should love the truth (Acts 10:33), recognize the value of a proper rebuke (Proverbs 27:5), and have a willingness to receive such (Proverbs 15:5,12;17:10).

<u>C oncluding thoughts:</u> Let us <u>always</u> speak G od's truth--not because we desire to make enemies; however let us always speak the truth even if it does change the dearest of friends into the bitterest of enemies as a consequence of our devotion and love for G od.
